V. Agenda Item: AHC GE Guiding Principles.

Background: The AHC General Education Guiding Principles include level, scope, integrity, generality, critical thinking, continuing study, and cultural diversity. There have been questions regarding how certain courses do not accurately meet the cultural diversity guiding principle. Consider: Category 1 Natural Sciences.

CULTURAL DIVERSITY: The course demonstrates sensitivity to cultural diversity and includes (a) exposure of students to diversity of cultural perspectives and examples where they relate to the subject matter, (b) utilization of resource materials, which draw upon and portray cultural diversity when appropriate to course content.

Discussion: Larry M. reviewed the current AHC GE Guiding Principles and presented the current language on cultural diversity. Through the years, the AP&P Committee has required that all the guiding principles must be met for a course to be considered for AHC General Education and occasionally commented on the applicability of cultural diversity as an "overreach" for certain courses. The consideration for making "cultural diversity" as an optional requirement was discussed.

- There were examples of how cultural diversity and inclusion can be integrated in various courses. For instance, a Botany course can delve into how certain plants have changed the course of history.
- The integration of IDEAA (inclusion, diversity, equity, accessibility, and antiracism) through intentional integration in the curriculum, not as a course element, but as part of instruction and content.
