- Fall 2022 program modification submission: We would like to add two courses to give students more choices in the area options; ART 122 (Drawing Area Option in addition to Art 121) and ART 107 (Digital Area Option). ART 122 has recently been submitted for C-ID ARTS 200 review and we expect it back soon. ART 107 can be accepted with an AAM and that is attached.
- Spring 2020 program modification submission: This program modification reflects the deletion of ART 125, ART 127, and ART 129 in the List A Painting Area and the addition of the new replacement painting course, ART 151.
- Original program submission: This program was developed per Senate Bill 440 that requires associate degrees for transfer be developed whenever there is a local degree that is comparable to an approved Transfer Model Curriculum (TMC). In Allan Hancock Colleges' case there is an associate degree in art for Art that does align with the Studio Arts TMC.

The Certificate in Pathways to U.S. Citizenship is designed to prepare students for the USCIS citizenship written and oral exams by providing instructions on U.S. government, history, and geography; how the application process works; and what to expect during an official oral interview. These skills will help students gain confidence to successfully apply for U.S. citizenship. Foreign-born workers make 83% of the earnings made by their native-born counterparts, and foreign-born workers who have yet to become citizens make even less. Naturalized citizens gain access to many of the benefits afforded to native-born and naturalized counterparts, including Social Security and Medicare. Workers will also be able to apply for many good-paying, government jobs that typically require applicants to be citizens.

Discussion:

- FASH 105. Megan S. presented the course. The course is based on a CSU-approved ethnic studies course in CSU Pomona. The course includes all the requisite competencies to be considered for CSU Area F. The course needs to be approved by the AHC senate and the AHC Board of Trustees prior to CSU evaluation for Area F. David DG stated that there is a required Ethnic Studies cross-listing for the course to be approved for summer 2023 offering. The initiator will create an ethnic studies course (tentatively ES 105) and will expedite review in the approval process.
- Lainey C. identified that there is an increased demand for the ethnic studies courses and there are insufficient offerings that students are either waitlisted or referred to other community colleges. The current waitlist practice blocks the students from enrolling on the waitlisted schedule creating an artificial barrier. The department continues to decide on additional course offerings.
- CA 120, CA 121, CA 325, FCS 120, and FSN 134. The proposals modified the course requisites from CA 124 or Food Handlers card to an advisory, CA 124. Lainey C. stated that in transition, there is a need to provide a blanket waiver for the current requisite.
