Background

Article V, Section 4, "Selection and Tenure," of the Auxiliary Programs Corporation Bylaws designates the college superintendent/president and chief financial officer as ex-officio voting directors of the corporation. The other three directors shall be selected as follows: one (1) academic administrator appointed by the superintendent/president; one (1) regular faculty member nominated by the Academic Senate and appointed by the superintendent/president; and one (1) student member nominated by the Associated Student Body Government and appointed by the superintendent/president. In addition, one (1) college trustee serves as a non-voting director.

- The superintendent/president reappoints George Railey, Jr., Associate Superintendent/Vice President, Academic Affairs, to serve as the academic administrator for 2017.
- On a nomination from the Academic Senate, the superintendent/president reappoints Andrea Sanders to serve as the faculty member for 2017.
- On a nomination from the Associated Student Body Government, the superintendent/president reappoints Mia Alvara to serve as the student member for the remainder of the academic year 2016-17.
- At its December 13, 2016 meeting, the Allan Hancock College Board of Trustees appointed Jeffery Hall to be the non-voting trustee director for 2017.

1. <u>Call to Order</u>

Michael Black called the meeting to order at 2:37 p.m. with the following directors present: Mia Alvara, Michael Black, Larry Lahr, George Railey, and Andrea Sanders.

2. Public Comment

No public comment was made.

3. Action Items

3.a. Approval of Minutes

3.c. PCPA Public Relations/Advertising Report of Promotions and Sponsorships of \$500 or Greater

On a motion by Larry Lahr, seconded by Mia Alvara, the board voted to approve the quarterly PCPA public relations/advertising expenses/in-kind trade and cash sponsorships of \$500 or greater for the period of August 1, 2016 through October 31, 2016.

4. Information Items

4.a. Financial Report for Auxiliary Programs

Michael Black shared the financial report through September 30. He noted, this report does not reflect \$50,000 for ASBG from bookstore proceeds. It will be reflected in the next quarterly financial statement.

Mr. Black responded to questions about the bookstore contract with Follett. He shared that the contract is valid for five years and the college receives a guaranteed minimum from Follett. The bookstore had been losing money before for about three years. Mr. Black noted the biggest challenge with all the bookstores is the internet and our biggest challenges in running the bookstore were lack of economies of scale, high labor costs, and supporting an independent IT system. It was not feasible for the college to continue running the bookstore.

Jennifer Schwartz gave a report on PCPA's budget and noted as of November 29, the budget has a positive net of \$26,000, which is not reflected on the financial report through September 30. She reported that ticket sales are going well, and they had a successful event for Royce Lewellen netting about \$100,000 which exceeded the anticipated goal. PCPA is applying for grants, doing basket appeals and targeting individual giving for year-end appeals in hopes of raising some more funds.

4.b. Oral Reports

Dr. Kevin Walthers arrived at 2:47 p.m.

PCPA:

Mark Booher reported that *Beauty and the Beast* has been well-received and has met 101 percent of its revenue goal. If the remaining 900 tickets are sold, it will break the half million dollar mark at the box office, which will be a best for a single-run of a show. He also noted, *Community Speaks* has opened and had performances in the Severson Theatre and in the community. The next show will be *You Can't Take It With You*.

Mr. Black noted an injunction had been placed on the wage order for increasing the minimum wage which could have a huge impact on PCPA.

ASBG:

Mia Alvara reported that ASBG will be participating in the "Parade of Lights" Christmas parade representing the college. She also announced a stress relief event for students in collaboration with Health Services called "Jingle Bell Rock Your Finals". Mr. Black complimented ASBG for their student activities and change in campus life.
