

MINIMUM ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS FOR TRANSFER	Upper Division Transfer = 60 semester units (UC Transferable): completion of 7 course pattern (2 Transferable English course; 1 IGETC transferable math course; and 4 transferable college courses chosen from at least 2 of the following IGETC subject areas – arts & humanities, social & behavioral sciences, and/or physical and biological sciences: Min. Transferable GPA = 2.4 (California resident) or 2.8 (non-resident). Lower Division Transfer: Must be UC eligible from high school. Most campuses do not accept lower division transfers. See a Transfer Center counselor for more information.	Upper Division Transfer = 60 semester units (CSU transferable): completion of 30 semester units of CSU general education requirements including (Oral Communication, Written Communication, Critical Thinking, and a transferable math course):Min.
