Information Item: College Now

Janet Hooghuis, Admissions & Records, reported that the CollegeNow course list will no longer require AP&P review/approval. CollegeNow course listings are courses that high school juniors and seniors come to Allan Hancock College to complete and not counted as concurrent enrollment when taken at the AHC campus.
