- The use of "Review and Modify Course" as the main proposal type for modifications except for text change and deactivate course. Text Change proposal type allows changes in text and no other fields.
- The revised BP/AP 4021 Program Vitality has provisions for other circumstances that warrant program deactivation that are exempt from evaluation team study.

Guided Pathways and Program maps are currently underway as the catalog and schedule team navigate the
features of CurriQunet. The role of the committee regarding program maps is not specific at this time. Vickey
S. has created a template for Chancellor's Office Curriculum Inventory (COCI) submission.

IV. Agenda Item: Evaluation Team Report Summary: Recommendation to Discontinue.

Provisions are:

- Detailed plan and recommended timeline for phasing out the program with the least impact on students, faculty, and community.
- A way for currently enrolled students to continue their programs of study or a plan for them to meet their educational objectives through alternative means.
- Consider the requirements of collective bargaining for full-time faculty and CSEA staff, including application of policies for reduction in force and opportunities for retraining.
- Continue to offer four courses:
 - ENVT 101. Introduction to Environmental Health and Occupational Safety. 3.0 units. It meets criteria for: AHC GE Area 5. Natural Science and AHC graduation requirement Health and Wellness. It can be offered Distance Education. Last successful offering: Fall 2024. 29 students.
 - ENVT 156. First Responder Operational (FRO). 1.0 unit. It is a requirement for Emergency Medical Services. AS and Certificate of Achievement. Each year, 25 students earn CalOES-CSTI FRO certificates. It is a local resource for business and government employers for CalOES-CSTI certificates.
 - ENVT 150. Hazardous Materials General Site Worker 40 Hours. 2.0 units. It is a stand-alone course for the local Certificate of Accomplishment: Environmental Health and Safety: Hazardous Materials General Site Worker. It is an employment requirement for all AHC CSEA employees who work with chemicals. It provides the mandated OSHA training and California State Office of Emergency Services certification for general industry and emergency response entities.
 - ENVT 450. HAZWOPER Refresher. 8 hours. 0.5 unit. It is a standalone course for the local certificate of accomplishment, Health and Safety: HAZWOPER Refresher 8 hour. It is an employment requirement for all AHC CSEA employees who work with chemicals. It provides the mandated OSHA training and California State Office of Emergency Services certification for general industry and emergency response entities.
 - The above courses may be considered for noncredit education or contract education.
- Timeline
 - 2025-26 Academic Year. ENVT course options will not be offered.

Five students are nearing completion of the ENVT degree. Meet with the counselor for alternate pathways. Enroll in ENVT 189. This will allow completion of degree requirements with no need to schedule historically under enrolled.

Background:

As described in the AP 4021 Program Vitality, the role of the Academic Planning and Policy Committee is to examine, research, and analyze the vitality report presented for program vitality review. Upon a thorough review of the vitality report, it will forward its recommendations to the Academic Senate.

The evaluation team completed the program vitality report for Environmental Health and Safety in Fall 2024 semester. The team reviewed qualitative and quantitative data to assess and evaluate the relevance and vitality of the program. The evaluation team included:

The evaluation team unanimously recommended discontinue (Yes: 7. No: 0. Abstain: 0) the Environmental Health and Safety Program. The Environmental Health and Safety certificate of achievement program requires 30 units with any 4-unit BIOL course, BIOL 120 Humans and Environment, any 4-unit CHEM, and 12 ENVT courses.

The decision to discontinue the ENVT (Environmental Technology) program stems from a combination of persistent challenges over the years. The program has consistently experienced low student enrollment, which has led to insufficient class sizes and limited. program sustainability. Additionally, the rate of student degree attainment has been minimal, indicating a lack of long-term engagement and success within the program. Furthermore, the program has struggled with low placement rates, with few graduates finding employment in the environmental industry. Despite efforts to address these issues, the ongoing lack of demand and the program's limited impact on student career outcomes have led to the conclusion that discontinuing the ENVT program is the most effective course of action.

Recommendation 1: Discontinue the Environmental Health and Safety (EH&S) program.

Recommendation 2: The committee unanimously agreed that there are components of the EH&S program that offer great value and are in the best interest of the college, its students, and the larger community. The evaluation committee recommended continued offering of these courses.

- ENVT 101 Introduction to Environmental Health and Occupational Safety (3.0 Units). This
 course fulfills AHC GE Area 5 Natural Sciences and Health and Wellness graduation
 requirements. It can be offered as a distance education. Enrollment has increased with DE
 offering. Fall 2024: two successful sections.
- ENVT 156 First Responder Operational (FRO) (1.0 Unit). It is a required course for the
 Emergency Medical Services Associate in Science and Certificate of Achievement. Each year
 approximately 25 EMS students earn Cal-OES-CSTI FRO certificates. It provides a local resource
 for business and government employers by offering new employees and incumbent workers
 cost effective Cal-OES-CSTI certificates.
- ENVT 150 Hazardous Materials General Site Worker-40 Hr. (2.0 Units). Students who
 complete this stand-alone course will earn an Environmental Health and Safety: Hazardous
 Materials General Site Worker Certificate of Accomplishment. It is an employment requirement
 for all AHC CSEA classified employes who work with chemicals. It provides the mandated OSHA
 training & California State Office of Emergency Services certification for general industry and
 emergency response entities.
- ENVT 450- HAZWOPER-Refresher 8 Hr. (0.5 Unit). Students who complete this stand-alone refresher course will earn Environmental Health & Safety: HAZWOPER Refresher 8 Hr. Certificate of Accomplishment. It is an employment requirement for all AHC CSEA classified employees who work with chemicals. It provides mandated OSHA training & California State Office of Emergency Services certification for general industry and emergency response entities.

Recommendation 3: The evaluation team recommended consideration for contract education and/or noncredit offering of ENVT 150 and ENVT 450 because these courses are important OSHA training and certification resources for local business and government agencies. The courses provide mandated training for new employees and incumbent workers to obtain required state certifications. Allan Hancock College offers CSTI instructor-led training at a fraction of what it costs to complete the courses with a private provider.

Recommendation 4: Recommend that the five students who are currently within a semester or two of completion, be enrolled in ENVT 189 with curriculum from their remaining courses. This would allow completion of their degrees without the impact of scheduling historically under enrolled sections beginning 2025-26 academic year.

Recommendation 5: Encourage the remaining declared ENVT students to meet with an academic counselor on alternate pathways.

Academic Planning and Policy Committee Recommendations:

- 1. Recognize the tremendous efforts of the evaluation team.
- 2. Clarify the name of the program to be discontinued.
- 3. Provide an update regarding the status of the four courses.
- 4. Implement the recommended course modifications to meet the industry's needs.
- 5. Implement the above plans to meet the student needs and modify as deemed appropriate to promote student success. Collaborate with counselors regarding the specific students.
- 6. Develop a timeline for creating course and program deactivation proposals.
