





Do you typically purchase course materials assigned for your courses?





How do you currently shop for course materials?









End up borrowing books from friend of library


It impacted my ability to be a successful student.

There is always the option of visiting the library for the texbooks, given the library hours, or students ability to visit during those specific hours.



How helpful would the promise of a zero-textbook cost degree be for you?









What is your enrollment status this semester?




