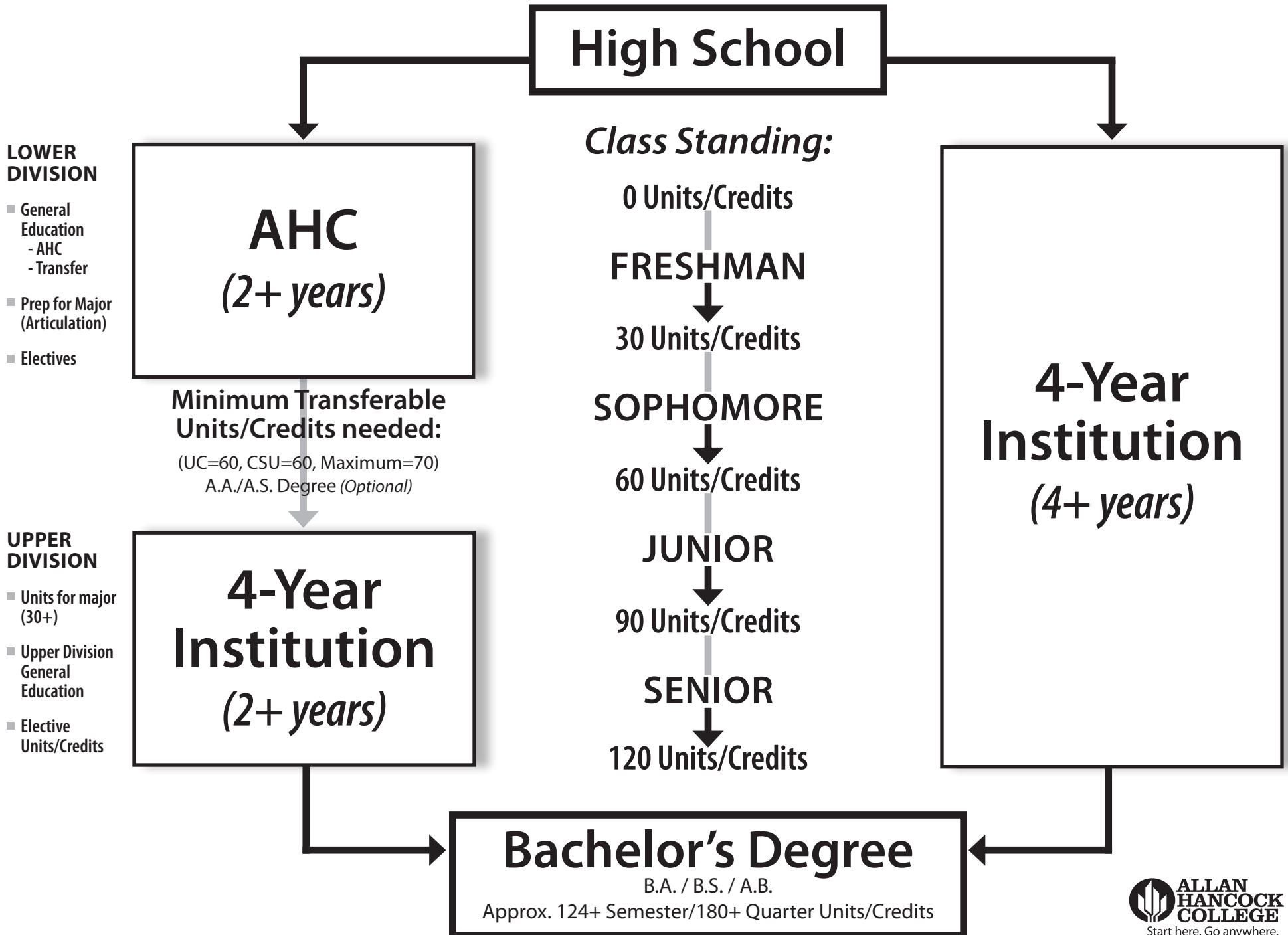

<b>MINIMUM ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS FOR TRANSFER</b>	<p><b>Upper Division Transfer = 60 semester units</b> (UC Transferable): <b>completion of 7 course pattern</b> (2 Transferable English course; 1 IGETC transferable math course; and 4 transferable college courses chosen from at least 2 of the following IGETC subject areas – arts &amp; humanities, social &amp; behavioral sciences, and/or physical and biological sciences: <b>Min. Transferable GPA = 2.4</b> (California resident) <b>or 2.8</b> (non-resident).</p> <p><b>Lower Division Transfer:</b> Must be UC eligible from high school. Most campuses do not accept lower division transfers. See a Transfer Center counselor for more information.</p>	<p><b>Upper Division Transfer = 60 semester units</b> (CSU transferable): <b>completion of 30 semester units of CSU general education requirements including</b> (Oral Communication, Written Communication, Critical Thinking, and a transferable math course):<b>Min. Transferable GPA = 2.0</b> (California Resident <b>or 2.4</b> (non-resident).</p> <p><b>Lower Division Transfer:</b> Must be CSU eligible from high school. Many campuses do not accept lower division transfers.
